Is it legal?

The IRS has determined clearly that churches may distribute voter guides regarding candidates' positions on issues including incumbents' votes on legislation. The publication however, must not endorse a particular candidate for office and a pastor may not endorse candidates on behalf of a church. Please share the **2010 Values Voter Guide** with your church.

We believe that being an informed voter is a matter of biblical stewardship of our government. Too often, those who hold traditional biblically based views on the important issues of our time either do not vote or cast an uninformed vote. The 2010 Values Voter Guide is a tool to help you determine whose positions best align with your values. We encourage you to contact the candidates in your district to ask further questions.

3. Do you support or oppose restoring full federal funding for abstinence until marriage education programs under Title V?
4. Do you support or oppose repealing the Federal Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA) that states that marriage is the union of one man and one woman and declares that states do not have to recognize same-sex marriages from other states?
5. Do you support or oppose repealing the federal health care reform bill?
6. Do you support or oppose the repeal of "Don't Ask, Don't Tell?"
7. Do you support or oppose the Unlawful Internet Gambling Enforcement Act which stops internet gambling?
8. Do you support or oppose the Parental Rights Amendment to the U.S. Constitution?
9. Do you support or oppose an individual's right to bear arms?
10. Do you support or oppose the cap and trade bill that places a tax on fossil fuels as a means of reducing carbon emissions?
11. Do you support or oppose the second Troubled Asset Relief Program (TARP) bill to bailout failing banks and businesses?
12. Do you support or oppose an amendment to the U.S. Constitution requiring a balanced federal budget?
13. Do you support or oppose trying foreign terrorists in U.S. civilian courts rather than before military tribunals?

1. Would you support or oppose the health insurance mandates in the federal health care reform bill?
2. Would you support or oppose adding "gender identity or expression whether real or perceived" being added to the anti-discrimination code?
3. Would you support or oppose amending the constitution to define marriage as between a man and a woman?
4. Do you support or oppose the definition of marriage as a union between a man and a woman as being a matter of discrimination, as defined by the SB121 anti-discrimination law?
5. Would you support or oppose the Parents Right to Know bill which would give parents the right to be notified about and opt their children out of potentially offensive material or resources in the classroom?
6. Would you support or oppose the creation of new gambling locations?
7. Would you support or oppose the right to have a deeply held religious belief about the definition of marriage without threat of civil or criminal liability and also the right to a trial by jury when accused of discrimination?
8. Did you or would you support or oppose legalized sports betting and table games in Delaware for the purpose of increasing revenues to state government?
9. Would you support or oppose legislation using buffers to limit education, protesting, and counseling near abortion clinics?
10. Would you support or oppose any future budget bill that does not include "Hyde" amendment language which bans tax payer funded abortions?
11. Do you support or oppose non-public school students having to pay for state mandated drivers' education which is provided free of charge to public school students?
12. Would you support or oppose using a combination of tax and fee increases to balance the budget in a financial shortfall?
13. Would you support or oppose cutting gross receipts tax including tax on food, transportation, housing, and clothes?
14. Would you support or oppose awarding Delaware's three Electoral College votes for President by National Popular Vote results vs a majority of Delaware voters as it is now?
